**The Mémorial de Caen
International Cartoon awards
For Human Rights**

Regulations

Art. 1: The organisers of the International Human Rights Cartoon Award are the Mémorial de Caen (Esplanade du Général Eisenhower, CS 55026, 14050 Caen cedex 4, France) and the association United Sketches for Freedom (Esplanade du Général Eisenhower, CS 55026, 14050 Caen cedex 4, France).

AIM OF THE AWARD

Art. 2: Press cartoonists committed to defending human rights are invited to participate by sending their cartoons according to the following regulations. **The theme is “defending human rights”**

WHO MAY TAKE PART AND HOW?

Art. 3: The application will officially open on **11 September 2017**.

Art. 4: Cartoonists from all over the world are invited to send their application and participate.

Art. 5: Cartoonists can maximum two cartoons. They must be sent in digital format according to the following definition: 300 DPI (minimum), A4 [21 x 29.7 cm] or A3 [29.7 x 42 cm] format. Cartoons must denounce a breach of human rights.

Art. 6: Cartoonists must send a short biography (300 characters in French or English) and a photo (portrait) together with their cartoons.

Art. 7: Cartoons must be sent to the following address only:
prixmemorial@unitedsketches.org before **midnight on 30 November 2017**.

SHORTLIST:

Art. 8: A jury will select a shortlist of cartoons for the final **by 20 December 2017**. The jury will select, at most, one cartoon per cartoonist.

The cartoonists whose artworks have been selected for the final will be informed by email. Shortlisted cartoonists will have their names and photographs published on the Mémorial de Caen and United Sketches websites.

Art. 9: Four prizes will be awarded: the Mémorial de Caen Cartoon Award for human rights, the Siné Award, the People's Choice Award and the Young Citizen award.

AWARDING OF PRIZES

Art. 10: In **January**, shortlisted cartoons will be published on social media. Subscribers to the Mémorial de Caen Facebook page will be asked to vote for the winner of the "People's Choice Award".

Art. 11: In **January**, students who are taking part or attending the high school Speeches for the Defence competition will be asked to vote for the winner of the "Young Citizen Award".

Art. 12: An official jury will select the winner of the Mémorial de Caen cartoon award for human rights

Art. 13: The winner of the Siné Award will be chosen by a jury chaired by Catherine Siné.

PRIZES

Art. 14: Mémorial de Caen Cartoon Award for human rights: 3,000 euros.

Art. 15: Siné Award: 1,000 euros.

Art. 16: People's Choice Award: 1,000 euros.

Art. 17: Young Citizen Award: 1,000 euros. Prize donated by United Sketches.

Art. 18: Shortlisted cartoonists will receive a prize of 150 euros from the Mémorial de Caen (except for the cartoonists who have won an award).

Art. 19: Prize winners will be officially announced at the Speeches for the Defence competition which will take place from Friday 26 January to Sunday 28 January 2018.

Art. 19: Cartoonists agree to their cartoons being published by the press, social media and awards organisers. They also accept that their cartoons will be used to promote the Mémorial de Caen Human award for human rights.

Art. 20: “In accordance with French data protection law, you have the right to access and rectify your personal data.”
